Paint, Paint, Paint is a week filled with brushes and color: we'll create our own paintings modeled from different 19th and 20th century art movements: Abstract, Expressionism, Surrealism, Pop Art and collage. Da Vinci, Picasso, Andy Warhol, Van Gogh and Matisse are some of the artists we will emulate.

### Wk 3 June 29-July 3

PORTRAITS! Have you ever wished you could draw or paint a realistic portrait of yourself or your friends? Using basic concepts of proportion, line, value, form and spacial relationships, discover how to build images of portraits and people, ad facial features and capture a likeness. Through a series of creative projects, experiment with a variety of media including watercolor, collage, acrylics, pastels and charcoal to create realistic and impressionistic images of the human face and figure.

### Wk 4 July 6-10

DRAW, WRITE AND BE PUBLISHED! Build your own story and characters during five days of creative writing, drawing, painting and illustrating culminating in your own book. After a few weeks you'll receive you very own paperback or hard bound version of your finished story!

### Wk 5 July 13-17

WATERCOLOR CAMPS Join this exploration of watercolor painting. Learn different wash and brush techniques while creating landscapes, abstracts, and paintings of everyday things.

SCENE PAINTING Anything that our eyeballs see is some kind of line or shape, whether it's a baseball in the corner of the garage or a stop sign on the street corner. Any color that you see when you view the foothills and mountains can be mixed with a brush and painted on canvas. Explore a wide variety of techniques in acrylic paints, watercolor, oil pastel and more to create outdoor scenes and vistas while learning how to see with your brush.

**DEEP BLUE** AGES: (5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> to 8) From the foamy surface to the darkest depths... Explore and create images of marine life and other unusual scenes and creatures from the world's vast oceans.

### **Group Piano Classes**

Featuring the Mayron Cole Method. Classes are offered at Open Arts Studio to students ages 5 and up. This is the leading group piano method in the United States and offers a comprehensive approach to learning piano, which appeals to children of different learning styles and levels. The three main components of the program include rhythm, keyboard geography, and reading notes on the grand staff. Practice on the piano, worksheets, rhythmic movement, theory games, and ensemble playing are included in each class. Classes are taught in a group format and children benefit from learning and playing with their peers, while still getting individual attention from the instructor.

### E-Z Keys Ages: (5 to 6)

There are three books in the E-Z Keys series.In E-Z Keys I, students learn the value of different notes (quarter note, half note, etc.) and the concept of rhythm is firmly established. The second E-Z Keys book focuses on learning the location of the C, D, and E keys and playing these notes in songs. E-Z Keys III introduces students to the F, G, A, andB keys.

### Menehune Music Ages: (7 to 8)

Menehune Music builds on the skills introduced in E-Z Keys and adds some new concepts. Students will learn about sharps, flats, dynamics and playing legato. Music theory worksheets found throughout the book help students review what they have learned.

### Level 1 Ages: (9 to 10)

In this level students delve even deeper into knowledge of the piano and music theory. They learn about tone clusters and accent marks, using the damper pedal, and playing with both hands while reading the grand staff.

### Level 2 Intermediate

Level 2 is for students who have taken piano before and are familiar with the basic concepts taught in the previous three levels. This class provides students with reinforcement on music theory, isolated practice of the left hand notes, and more opportunities to improve playing notes on the grand staff.

### Levels 3-4 Advanced

These levels are for advanced students who are ready to play all their pieces with both hands and learn more complicated music theory. Please call the studio to arrange a day and time for an audition to find out what level to begin at and a day and time for the classes.
