Summer Has Arrived—A Few Important Reminders

After what felt like endless rain, summer is finally here! It's great to see everyone out enjoying the season—working on their homes, spending time outdoors, and heading to the lake.

With the recent spike in temperatures, lake activity has understandably increased. We'd like to remind everyone to exercise caution and courtesy on the water. Please be mindful of kayaks, paddle boards, and other non-motorized watercraft. In particular, reduce your speed when passing near the beach to avoid creating large wakes that can pose a risk to others.

Our lifeguards are now on duty and diligently watching over our most important assets—our children and grandchildren. That said, parental supervision remains essential. Please ensure you're keeping a close eye on your own children while they're at the beach.

Important Information Request Enclosed

Included in this mailing is a form requesting updated information about your heating system. As part of our annual compliance review, Vails Grove is verifying that all residents with oil tanks carry the required insurance, as outlined in our rules and regulations.

Years ago, the co-op made a proactive decision to require insurance coverage to protect against potential soil contamination from leaking oil tanks—something that can be extremely costly to remediate. If you have an aboveground or underground oil tank, you must carry insurance that protects the co-op from environmental damage. Insurance options are limited, but ProGuard is a local provider we recommend contacting. If you are unable to obtain coverage—for example, if your policy has lapsed and your tank is underground—you may be required to remove the tank. Please contact the office if this applies to you so we can assist and ensure the Grove remains protected.

Update Your Contact Information - The enclosed form also allows you to update your contact details. It is vital that the co-op can reach you in the event of an emergency. Please ensure that your home phone number, cell number, and email address are current and on file with the office.
